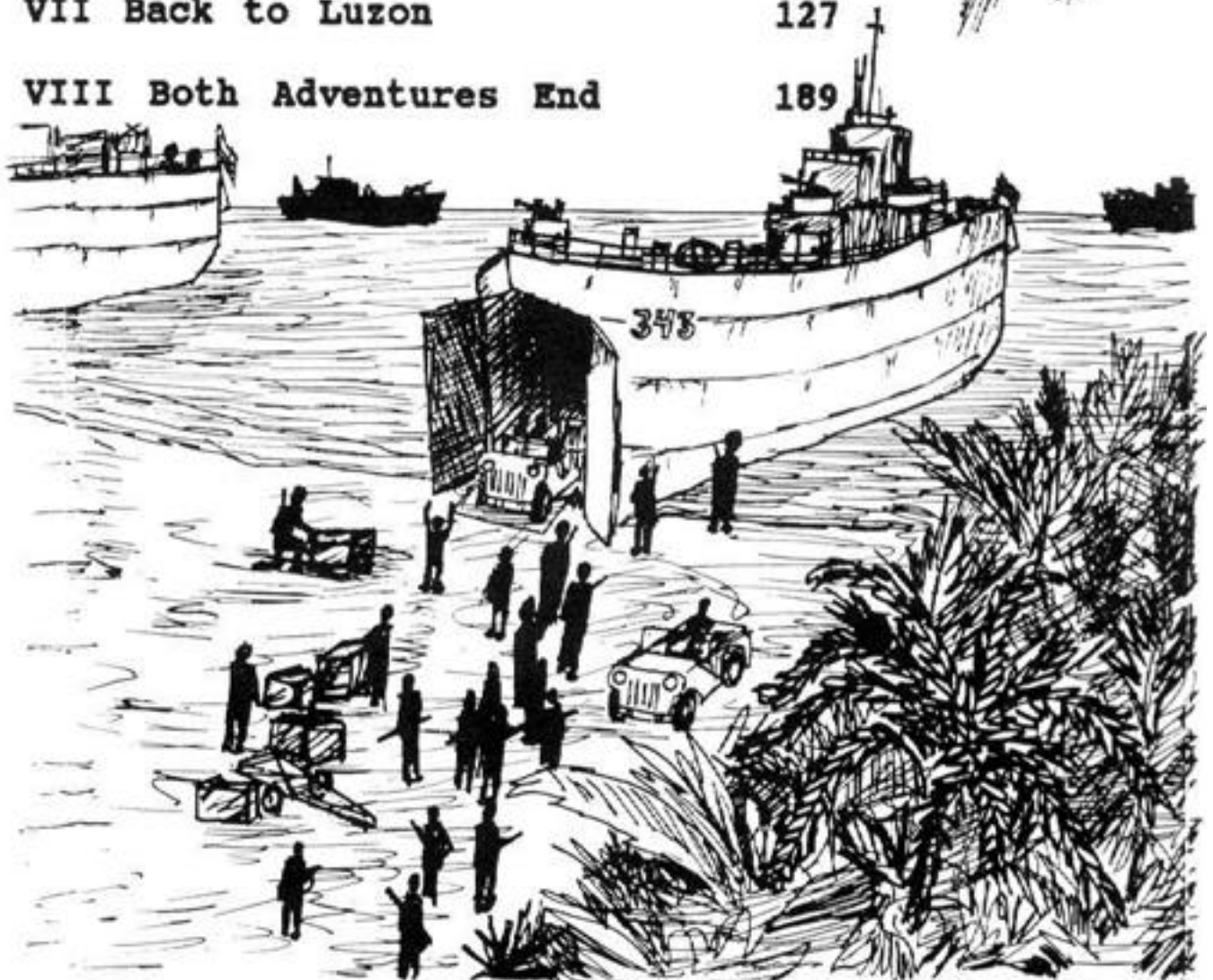
JUSTIN R. TAYLAN

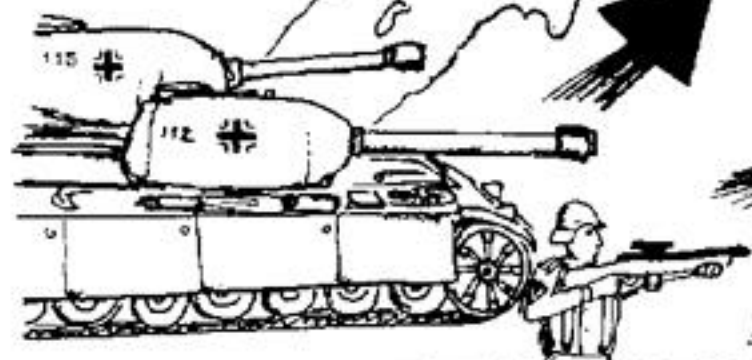

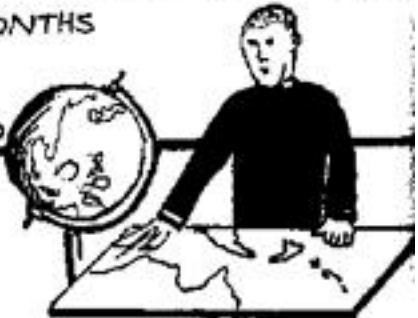
